AGRICULTURAL GENDER GAP



WOMEN MAKE UP ONLY A **SMALL** PERCENTAGE OF **LANDHOLDERS** AND
OFTEN HAVE **LESS** ACCESS THAN MEN TO THE **CASH** AND **CREDIT**
TO BUY NECESSARY TOOLS, FERTILIZERS AND SEEDS.

THEY HAVE ALSO **REDUCED** ACCESS TO **EDUCATION**, **OUTSIDE FUNDING**, OR **CO-OPS**.

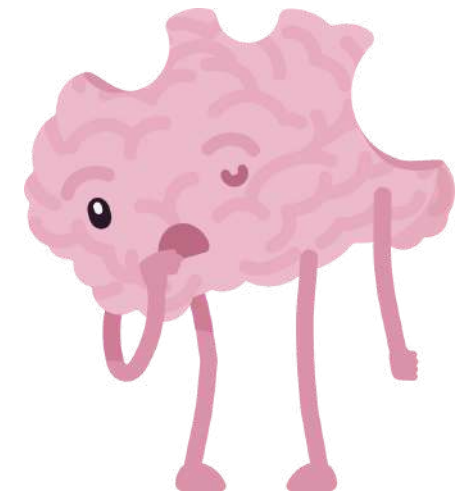
BEING IN A HOT AND UNPLEASANT ENVIRONMENT CREATES **IRRITABILITY** AND **AGGRESSIVE** THOUGHTS AND **REDUCES** POSITIVE EMOTIONS.

EPIDEMIC DISEASES



CLIMATE CHANGE CAN INFLUENCE THE GEOGRAPHICAL **DISTRIBUTION** AND **SEASONALITY** OF **VECTOR-BORNE DISEASES** SUCH AS MALARIA, DENGUE AND LYME DISEASE.

DEPRESSION, SUICIDE, MENTAL ILLNESS



THE ASSOCIATION OF CLIMATE CHANGE-RELATED AIR POLLUTION WITH ADVERSE BIRTH OUTCOMES AND THEIR PSYCHOLOGICAL SEQUELAE AND DEVELOPMENTAL PROBLEMS IN CHILDREN **INCREASES** MENTAL DISTRESS FOR WOMEN AND THE RISKS OF DEPRESSION, SUICIDE AND DEMENTIA.

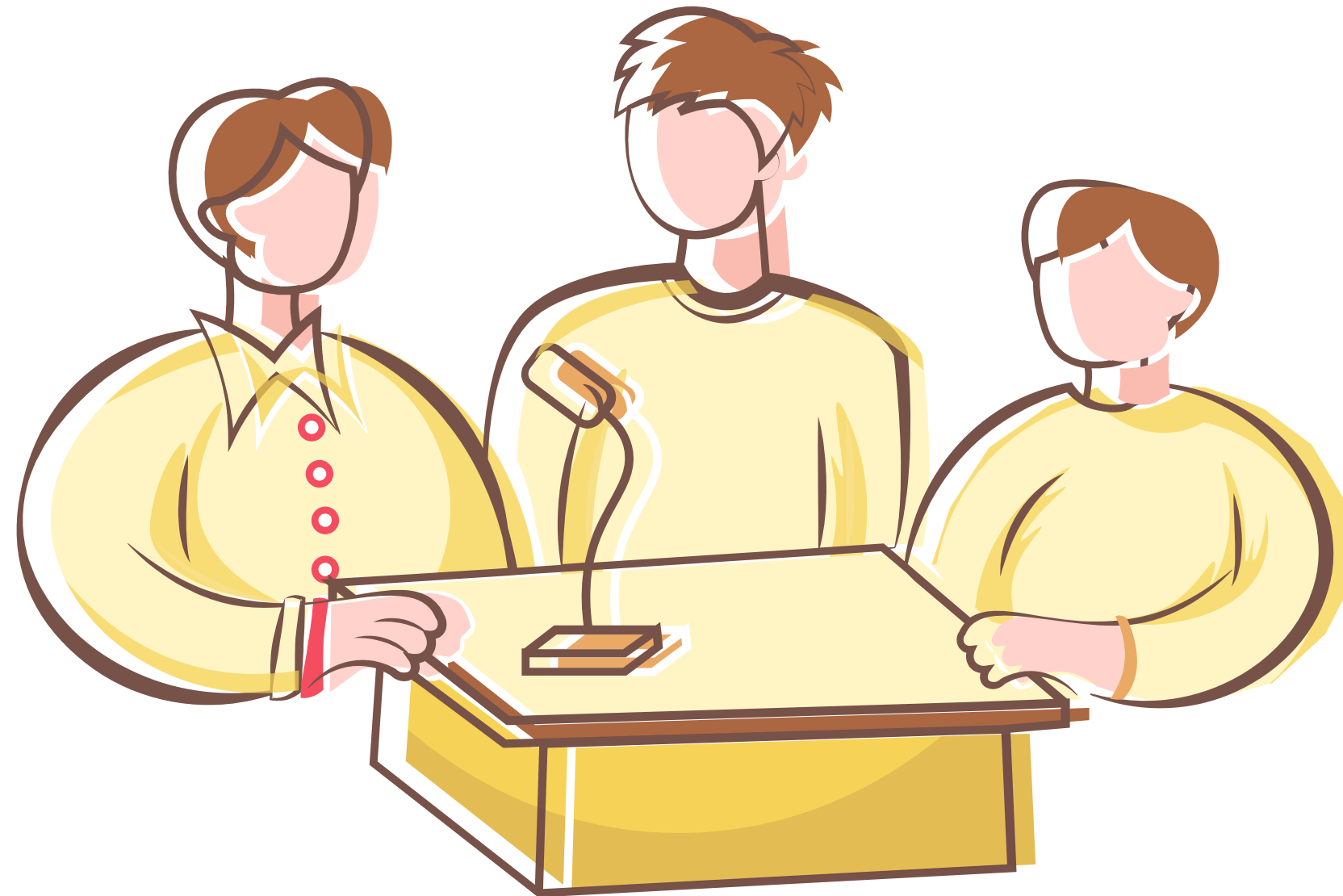
